

Your voice

Let's not overcomplicate the transition task I'm interested in seeing and hearing about best practice beyond basic compliance The resources are great but also somewhat overwhelming to keep up with My concern is ensuring our understanding is at a level that makes the adoption of the strengthened Standards a task that is not too demanding

Many providers are concerned about staff burnout and the challenge of maintaining quality care while meeting new regulatory requirements Our biggest concern is the cultural shift required. Staff will need additional training and support to understand and embrace the changes, and it will take sustained effort to embed the new requirements into everyday practice


